

# Heart is a Drum

*Heart is a Drum* uses more than one guitar on the recording; this chart is a distillation of what you hear. It can be played with either a pick or finger-style; both will work well. If you are having trouble reading this chart, or with combining chords and finger-picking, check out **Modern Guitar Chord Styles, Volume 1** - it's a systematic approach to learning common chords, strumming patterns, rhythm reading, bar-chords, chord-change techniques, arpeggio styles & fingerpicking.
