## Chords

Chord diagrams and musical notation for the following chords:

- G**: Diagram shows two open strings (B and G) and three fretted strings (D, E, A). Musical notation shows a G major triad.
- G7**: Diagram shows two open strings (B and G) and three fretted strings (D, F, A). Musical notation shows a G dominant seventh triad.

### Handy hints

In bar one, the semiquaver strum at the end of the 2nd beat **must** be an upstroke; it is important you land on a downstroke on the next beat. To learn more about this refer to pages 10 & 31 in *Modern Guitar Chord Styles, Volume I*. Although the basic form of F major will work in the ending section of Hey Jude, the bar-chord form will sound better (Volume I, page 34).

**To change key:** Capo at II for the key of A Major; III for Bb Major; or at V for F Major. To learn more about using a capo to change the key of a song see pages 36 - 37 in *Modern Guitar Chord Styles I*
